

There will be two Masses on Ash Wednesday, March 5,2025 at 12:00 noon & 7:00pm.

What Is Ash Wednesday? The Beginning of Lent

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent, the 40-day journey leading to Easter Sunday. It's a time for Catholics to prepare their hearts for the joy of Christ's resurrection through <u>prayer</u>, fasting, and almsgiving.

Why Ashes?

The ashes we receive on Ash Wednesday are a profound symbol of humility and mortality. They remind us of Genesis 3:19: "Remember, you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Attend Mass or a Service


Make Ash Wednesday a priority by attending a service to receive ashes and start Lent with intention.
